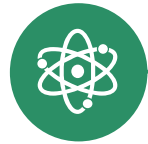
Matching Headings to Paragraphs

Tests understanding of detailed information.



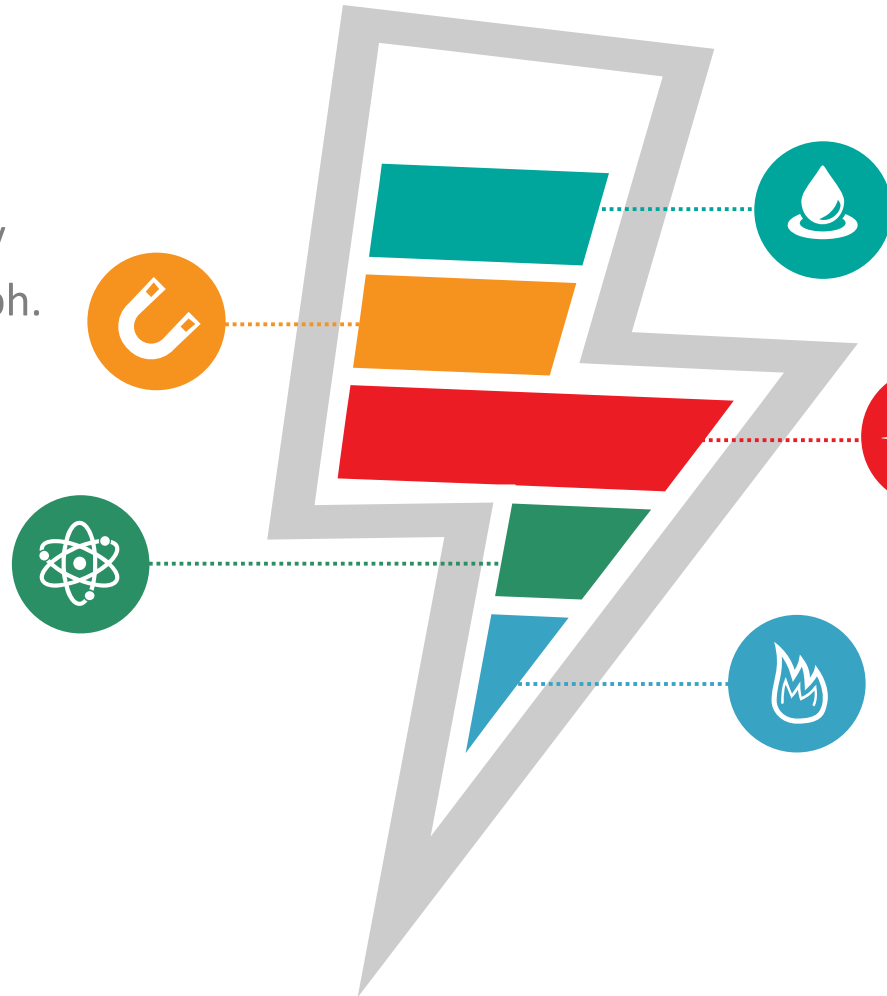
Short Answer Questions
